About the MeRIT Program

MeRIT is a training program designed to assist pharmacists with developing the abilities necessary to conduct investigator-initiated research, either independently as a principal investigator or as an active co-investigator within a research team. The 2-year longitudinal program utilizes a combination of teaching and mentoring methods (live events, webinars, and teleconferences) to provide mentees with the education and support needed throughout the entire research experience, i.e. from idea to publication.

Highly skilled clinical, basic science, and biostatistician researchers are on-site teaching and guiding investigator participants.
