CRITICAL ISSUE 1: How can the ACCP Foundation support clinical pharmacist researchers, scholars, and practitioners?

SD 1.1: Diversify the portfolio of Foundation-funded initiatives to better meet ACCP member needs.

Obj 1.1.1 By 2022, launch a Medication Optimization Grant RFA.

Obj 1.1.2 By 2023, explore the feasibility of offering additional investigator development opportunities.

Obj 1.1.3 By 2023, collaborate with ACCP and PPI to develop and implement a scholar development program focused on prospective practice-based research.

Obj 1.1.4 By 2023, implement innovative practice mini-sabbaticals or clinical traineeships.

SD 1.2: Support the development and dissemination of practice innovations.

Obj 1.2.1 By 2023, develop and implement an award honoring clinical practice innovations.

Obj 1.2.2 By 2024, develop and implement a competitive research grant award for prospective practice-based research focused on practice innovation.

Obj 1.2.3 By 2023, provide scholarships/matching funds for members seeking to complete ACCP professional development programs in practice innovation/advancement.

CRITICAL ISSUE 2: How will the Foundation increase engagement of clinical practitioners, trainees, and students in research and scholarship to advance human health?

SD 2.1: Expand opportunities across the career continuum for clinical pharmacists to engage in research and scholarship.

Obj 2.1.1 By 2023, establish a program to facilitate pharmacy student participation in research internships.

Obj 2.1.2 By 2023, explore the feasibility of offering research grants for mid-career members.

Obj 2.1.3 By 2023, in collaboration with ACCP and/or PPI, engage a diverse group of accomplished

ACCP experts to mentor members seeking to advance their scholarship.

Obj 2.1.4 By 2023, provide scholarships/matching funds for members seeking to complete ACCP professional development programs in research and scholarship.

SD 2.2: Increase Foundation communications emphasizing ACCP professional development opportunities in research and scholarship.

Obj 2.2.1 By 2023, develop new communications highlighting the broad spectrum of research and scholarship addressed in the ACCP Research and Scholarship Academy, the MeRIT Program, and the FIT Program.

Obj 2.2.2 By 2023, enhance the promotion of PPI/Foundation collaborative educational programs.

Obj 2.2.3 By 2022, work with communications staff to develop social media communications that emphasize both the content and the outcomes of ACCP professional development programs for researchers and scholars.

SD 2.3: Expand efforts to promote clinical pharmacy research and scholarship.

Obj 2.3.1 By 2022, collaborate with ACCP and PPI to promote the outcomes of research and scholarship funded by the Foundation.

Obj 2.3.2 By 2023, release an ongoing series of videos and/or podcasts of ACCP members sharing their stories of research and scholarship experiences throughout their career.

Obj 2.3.3 By 2023, establish a “Member Spotlight” feature on ACCP/Foundation websites to promote successful clinical pharmacy researchers and scholars.

CRITICAL ISSUE 3: How can the ACCP Foundation establish and maintain long-term relevance?

SD 3.1: Ensure the Foundation employs practices that embrace diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) to achieve its mission.

Obj 3.1.1 By 2022, provide professional development on DEI for Foundation leadership.

Obj 3.1.2 By 2023, incorporate DEI principles into grant/award selection criteria.

Obj 3.1.3 By 2022, intentionally incorporate DEI principles into promotion of ACCP research and scholarship development programs.

SD 3.2: Ensure that Foundation efforts meaningfully enhance ACCP members' research, scholarship, and practice.

Obj 3.2.1 By 2022, assess member needs for support in the areas of research, scholarship, and practice.

Obj 3.2.2 By 2023, based on 3.2.1, identify and develop and/or enhance programs/services that meaningfully support ACCP members' research, scholarship, or practice.

Obj 3.2.3 By 2024, monitor and evaluate how effectively Foundation programs/services are meeting member needs.

SD 3.3: Communicate the value of the Foundation to ACCP members.

Obj 3.3.1 By 2022, continue implementation of the components of the Communications Plan that emphasize the value of the Foundation.

Obj 3.3.2 By 2023, Increase recognition of Foundation donors across the spectrum of the College.

Obj 3.3.3 Develop a Foundation brand that is recognized across the ACCP membership.
